Procedural Writing Anchor Chart

Procedural Writing is an explanation of how something came to be or how something works.

Features:

- normally starts with descriptive statements about the subject.
 This paragraph states the main idea or the "why?" we do this particular task.
- follows a set of logical and sequential steps
- the how and why we do it
- written in present tense
- · use descriptive word choice:
- exciting verbs
- adjectives and adverbs to make the procedure clear (stir <u>quickly</u> or use <u>black</u> pepper)
- use linking or transitional words (if, then, first, second, finally...)
 - End with an excellent closing paragraph that restates the main idea!
